

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
HELD ON NOVEMBER 9, 1971

The regular meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held on November 9, 1971, at 7:30, in the Township Municipal Building. All members of the Board were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The treasurer's report was read and a motion was made to pay the bills. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

A letter was read from Robert Ayer concerning the proposed purchase of the land of Thomas and Jane Seliga. The Park and Recreation Board felt that the land in question would be beneficial to the Township but thought that the present asking price was too high at this time. The Board felt that if the owners were agreeable to reduce the cost then the Supervisors might look at it more favorably. Mr. Williams agreed with Mr. Ayer and will contact the owners and negotiate.

Mr. Levine spoke concerning the proposed Resolution from the Centre County Solid Waste Authority that College Township adopt transportation of solid waste collection and disposal. The Township has an Ordinance along with Centre Region but there are some differences. One major difference under the County Ordinance is that compactor trucks are not required but rather a covered vehicle with a metal lined, water-tight body of easily cleanable construction. Mr. Williams stated that Centre Region should maintain the same Ordinance along with the County. The Supervisors agreed to further discuss the proposed Ordinance during the month.

The costs involved with the access road to the new hospital were discussed by Mr. Williams. A federal road would have cost

somewhere around \$150,000 which the Supervisors felt was too much for the region to pay. With the consent of the hospital it was agreed to put in a usual Township road which would be far cheaper. The total completed cost of the access road was \$3,304.75, to be shared by all Centre County municipalities, College Township's share being \$452.75. According to Mr. Williams, the road will hold up fine until the permanent road comes in which will be constructed by the State when the middle section of the State College Bypass is built.

A letter was read from Mr. Speegle of the Department of Transportation concerning the service road recently paved for the Township. The letter stated that the service road has been assigned Township Road #881 and from November 3, 1971, College Township is required to maintain the road.

Mr. Williams gave an account of the meeting in Harrisburg with Mr. Kassab, Secretary of Highways, concerning the construction of the centre section of the State College Bypass. The meeting was represented by the Centre Regional Planning Commission, members of the Highway Committee of COG and the County Planning Director. The main concern of the meeting was the intersection of the Bypass with route 26. Mr. Steve Thompson, of the Centre Regional Planning office, came up with a plan which Mr. Kassab was receptive to. Mr. Williams showed maps of the Bypass and pointed out Mr. Thompson's proposed intersection. Also, Mr. Williams reported that the centre section of the Bypass has been put back in the 1971-72 highway budget.

A proposed Resolution, from Dave Allison of the Sewer Authority, for application of federal assistance for expansion of the College Harris Joint Authority sewage line system, was received by the

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Supervisors for their approval of the goals and objections. Mr. Levine said that the Supervisors would review the Resolution and take action at next month's meeting.

As soon as snow fences are put in, Mr. Williams reported that a notice will hopefully be advertised for Leaf Collection on Monday November 22, 1971.

A Final Plan of the Subdivision of Meadowtract farm located in Oak hall and owned by Fred Homan was submitted to the Board for their approval. Designated changes of the tract size required by the Planning Commission were completed. The Supervisors accepted the plans and signed them.

Preliminary Plans for the Subdivision of the property of Fred Homan lying on the southeast side of the intersection of the Boalsburg Pike and The State College Bypass, were also submitted to members of the Board. This property lies mainly in Harris Township but the piece of land in question is in College Township. This land is to be dedicated as park space to the Township and requires approval of the Supervisors. The Supervisors agreed to accept the piece of land and signed the plans.

The Final Plan of the resubdivision of the Ken Walker farm, located on the east side of the intersection of Elmwood Street and the Benner Pike were approved and signed by the Supervisors.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:15.
