

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON
DECEMBER 2, 1970.

The regular meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held in the Municipal Building on December 2, 1970, at 7:30 P.M. All Supervisors were present.

The minutes of the November 10th, meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's Report - The Treasurer reported in detail the expenditures in the amount of \$7,554.23, leaving a balance of \$34,952.60.

Old Business: Mr. Williams, reported that the school light on Houserville Rd., had been repaired. Mr. Levine, reported that no recommendation had come from the Solicitor, on sewer variance requests. Hence, no action would be taken until a letter was received from the Township Solicitor. Mr. Williams, reported that he had not met with the Highway Supervisor concerning the traffic safety problem on Route 322, in the area of Harris Acres. He was waiting for a petition from the residents which he had not received.

New Business: Mr. Levine, said the budget for the coming year would be ready by the next meeting. He said, that the budget for the coming year would be \$2,63,226.96.

\$1,61,559.00 - for general government expenses, administration, protection, planning, the Township Share of the Regional Code Enforcement Library.

2,250.00 - for the Landfill Operation.

18,466.00 - for Highway Liquid Fuel.

55,418.00 - for Recreation Development (\$40,000 of this is the State grant) for Spring Lea Park.

13,649.00 - for Equipment Account.

7,477.00 - for Fire Protection.

6,830.00 - for Street Lights.

Mr. Levine, stated that the tax rate will remain the same at .4 mills. Of this .2 mills general fund, .1 mill equipment, .1 recreation. The Township is reducing the Fire Hydrant Fee, from 5¢ a front foot to 3¢ a front foot. Mr. Levine,

explained that the State no longer appropriates money given to the School Board, for recreation, hence, there is a three (3) year phase out, with the Township assuming a larger share of the recreation expense each year. He also said, that there is a possibility of obtaining a Federal Grant for recreation use.

The Supervisors appointed Roger Granlund, to the College-Harris Joint Authority.

A Preliminary Report on the water study, was given by Mr. Dan Cytrynowicz, of John Larkin Engineering. Mr. Cytrynowicz, explained, that four (4) water companies serve the township at the present time. The Lemont Water Co., Oak Hall Water Co., State College Water Co., and the Harris Township Water Co. . The Lemont Water Co., serves the largest number of township residents. He explained, that the purpose of the study was to determine present use, and the future needs of the township, both commercial and residential. It is difficult, to predict the potential commercial and industrial use, but the residential use is calculated on the basis of accurate population figures. He stated, that there was a great discrepancy between the Federal Census, the School Board Census and The Centre County population count. He would attempt to determine, which population total was most accurate.

Mr. Cytrynowicz, discussed the Lemont Water Co., and stated that their figures were confusing, since there was a large amount of water being used, that could not be accounted for. Also, the daily water use figure was very high. This could be due to defective meters or a lack of meters in some areas. He said, that accurate figures on the water consumption by Lemont were critical, if the Township would ever consider purchase of the Company. Mr. Cytrynowicz said, sources of supply, both present and future must be identified. All of the foregoing considerations, must be accurately studied by the Township, before any steps are taken to purchase the Water Company. Otherwise, the Township, could find after purchasing the company, that they could not meet the water supply needs of the community.

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Mr. Levine, asked Mr. Cytrynowicz, to try and have the final report ready by the January meeting.

Also, Mr. Levine said, that the Highway Department, would meet tomorrow, December 3, 1970, with the Townships of College Spring, and Benner, to study the relocation of Benner Pike.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 9:00 P.M.
