

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS HELD
DECEMBER 7, 1971

The regular meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held on December 7, 1971, at 7:30 P.M., in the Municipal Building. All members of the Board were present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Also, the minutes of the special meeting held November 22, 1971 at 12:00 noon, were read and approved. The purpose of the meeting was to accept a resolution endorsing the Areawide Statement of Goals and Objectives of the Centre County Planning Commission.

The treasurer's report was read and a motion was made to pay the bills. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

The Supervisors passed a resolution to make final application in the National Flood Insurance Program for College Township. By participating in this program, the Township provides the opportunity for residents to purchase flood insurance through regular agencies at a discount. The program provides coverage on any flood damage whatsoever. It only requires that municipalities have a Flood Control Ordinance in order to be eligible. Mr. Levine also stated that anyone wishing to apply for this insurance would automatically be accepted before December 31, 1971.

The deed for a 500 foot extension of First Avenue near Nease Chemical Company was presented to the Supervisors and a motion was made by Mr. Williams to accept the road. It was seconded by Mr. Weaver and passed unanimously.

Mr. Levine reported that the 1972 budget will be available for public display at the Municipal Building for twenty days beginning Thursday, December 9th. The proposed budget of \$407,760. will officially be adopted by the Supervisors at a special meeting to

be held on December 30th.

Total anticipated funds for the general fund claimed the largest sum at an estimated \$178,158. Regional park and recreation programs were the second largest at an estimated \$161,379. Mr. Levine stated that \$140,000 of it would be reimbursed by state and federal recreation grants. Part of the general fund is for regional programs with \$12,934 allotted for purchasing fire equipment and acquiring a training site, and \$8500 for the regional police communications system.

Other categories of the budget were, \$38,912.97 anticipated spending for Highway Liquid Fuel - \$18,700 for the equipment account - \$5310 for fire protection and \$5300 for street lights.

The Supervisors expect a year end surplus of \$12,000 under the current taxation rate. According to the present budget, no tax change is in sight.

In other business at the meeting, Mr. Roger Granlund was re-appointed representative of the College-Harris and University Area Joint Authorities following the expiration of his term last August.

In other action, the Supervisors decided to remove Ernest McChesney from the Planning Commission because he has been unable to attend their meetings. The Supervisors plan to select a new member at their December 30th meeting. It was requested that a letter be sent to Mr. McChesney informing him of this decision.

A representative from the Radio & TV Association was present at the meeting to discuss passing a possible ordinance preventing anyone from acquiring a total monopoly of any one product or service in the Township. For instance, the representative used the Centre Video Corporation as a possible example of this type of situation in the future, since they are equipping the new Hospital with tele-

visions. The Supervisors were not aware of such a problem of this kind arising and stated they would look into the matter.

Since the results of the recent Citizen Attitude Survey had not been published, Mrs. Smith questioned what was being done to inform people of the outcome. A Summary Report has been written by Mr. Trotter and copies of it were made available for those interested, following the conclusion of the meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:07 PM.
