

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON
March 3, 1970

The regular meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held in the Municipal Building at 7:30 p.m. on March 3, 1970. All supervisors were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held on February 3rd were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report The Board approved payment of bills for February in the amount of \$6,209.18, leaving a balance of \$13,397.28.

New Business A letter from Eugene Fulmer asking whether or not the supervisors had approved the take-over of Whitehall Road by the State Highway Department was discussed. The Board reviewed the most recent map from the Highway Department to determine if right-of-way missed the tree line and the properties along the road in Everhart Village. Mr. Williams moved and Mr. Weaver seconded the following resolution: That the Board notify Mr. Fulmer that the Board accepts the the Department of Highways assumption of Whitehall Road in the location and according to the specifications shown on the map labelled Corridor Location Study, Whitehall Road Relocation, (L.R. 14014) Centre County, College Township and State College Borough, sent to us on February 25th. The resolution was passed.

Bid Openings The following bids were received for the police cruiser. Stocker Chevrolet, Inc. total bid of \$2,910.00 with \$450. trade in allowance or \$2,460.00. Miller McVeigh total bid of \$3070.00 with trade-in allowance of \$400.00, or \$2,670.00. Nelson's Nittany Motors total bid of \$3991.82 with trade-in allowance of \$1,460.00 or \$2,531.82. Mr. Williams moved and Mr. Weaver seconded a motion that the Board award the bid to the lowest bidder, Stocker Chevrolet, Inc. if, after checking, the specifications agree with those on the bid notice.

The Board discussed a letter from Charles J. Weyandt, of Weyandt and

Dunaway attaching a petition signed by a number of local businessmen asking that the Board consider repealing the sign ordinance.

Mr. Levine stated that, since the Board had approved the sign ordinance, because it had the support of a large number of residents of the township, they were not at this meeting taking any action to change or repeal it. The Board, did refer the letter and petition to the Sign Review Board, which has scheduled a meeting in April to discuss the Ordinance and possible revisions to clarify some of its provisions.

A plan to subdivide 4.59 acres along Branch Road about 1 mile southwest of Lemont, owned by J. Hutchison and Mildred Mitchell so that title could be transferred to Katherine Mitchell was considered. There was some question as to whether or not the plan met all the requirements of a final plan under the Subdivision Regulations, and the Board referred it back to the Planning Commission for further review.

Mr. Granlund, a member of the Building Board of Appeals asked when the Board would have a meeting. He felt that there would be some problems referred to it soon resulting from sewer connections. Mr. Williams said that he would call a meeting of the Board within the next two weeks to that it could elect officers set a meeting date schedule.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
