

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISOR'S MEETING, COLLEGE TOWNSHIP HELD ON
JULY 9, 1968

The meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held in the Municipal Building at 7:30 p.m. on July 9, 1968. Present were Levine and Williams. Mr. Weaver was absent because of illness. Because of Mr. Weaver's absence, there was no Treasurer's report.

Old Business Spring Lea Drive Intersection. A letter from Mr. D'Antonio inquiring whether or not the Board was interested in buying his entire lot at the intersection of Spring Lea Drive rather than the 20 feet needed was discussed. The supervisors decided to ask the township solicitor to notify Mr. D'Antonio that the township had no use for the entire lot and that they would consider no change in their original offer.

The Chairman stated that it had been necessary for the supervisors to take legal action against the Hilltop Mobile Home Park because of violations of the Zoning Ordinance. He stated that the Board had received a number of petitions from residents of the mobile home park protesting the action, but that the Board was charged with the responsibility of enforcing the Ordinance and had no choice in this case but to take the necessary legal action.

The supervisors approved a resolution assuming responsibility for the obligation to pay the annual energy and maintenance charges for the lighting system for the interchange on the State College Bypass.

New Business A petition from four residents of First Avenue requesting a "Dead End" sign at the entrance of their street had already been approved and the sign had been ordered.

A petition from 51 residents of Oak Hall requesting the supervisors to take some action against Hanover Canning Company to control the noxious odors emanating from the waste matter. Mr. Williams stated that he and a representative of the Department of Health have inspected the waste disposal and found that, contrary to regulations, the ditches were open, contained decomposing waste matter, stagnant water and the odor was foul. A letter had been written to Mr. Brooks of Hanover ordering the cannery to abide by the Health Department regulations and the township garbage ordinance requiring that the ditches be filled immediately with at least six inches of dirt as a cover. No response had been made to the letter and Mr. Williams had been there today, found the ditches still uncovered and he had photographed the area. The Supervisors decided that unless the company immediately complied with the ordinance, a complaint would be filed against the canning company. The solicitor will be so notified.

Plans from the architect for the Meyer Brothers Dairy Store were presented to the Board. The supervisors accepted the plans for further study.

A letter from the People Against Ketch was tabled until Mr. Weaver could return.

There being no further discussion, the floor was open for questions from residents. Mr. Charles Rollis reviewed his problems with the Evergreen Trailer Court, concerning sewage leakage, illegal parking of trailers on

his property and other difficulties. He urged that the Supervisors speed up court action to enforce the Board of Adjustment ruling on the trailer court. The Board agreed to take the necessary steps to hasten court action in this case.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
