

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS OCTOBER 5, 1971

The regular meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held on October 5, 1971, at 7:30, in the Township Building. All members of the Board were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The treasurer's report was read and Mr. Williams made a motion to pay the bills. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Bids received to furnish 400 tons of bulk Rock Salt for College Township were opened by the Supervisors. Four companies offered bids as follows: International Salt @ 16.09 ton, Cargill Salt @ 16.30 ton, Bradco Supply @ 17.25 ton, and Morton Salt @ 16.09 ton. The contract was awarded to Morton Salt Company because it has stockpiles located near the area. Mr. Williams made the motion and Mr. Weaver seconded it.

Mr. Robert Hunter, President of the Board of Trustees, and Mrs. Peggy Dukes were present at the meeting to discuss the expenditures for the Schlow Memorial Library for 1972. Mr. Williams questioned the \$4500 pay raises and stated that the Council of Governments would hold the line at \$3700. Mr. Hunter pointed out that salary increases had not been considered for the last two years but felt that COG's decision was fair enough and would go along. The Supervisors agreed to contribute the necessary \$5940, a \$590 increase from last year, 10% of the total budget, as their share of support for the Schlow Library.

The Supervisors made an inspection of Big Hollow Road and agreed that the road needed improvement. It was decided that the road would be widened ~~and repaved sometime~~ this winter or the beginning of next year. The curve would also be taken care of as soon as possible.

The official dates for Trick or Treat nights in College Township were established as October 29 & 30.

Riff-Raff Collection dates were agreed to be October 18-19-20. Mr. Williams said a notice would be advertised in the newspapers sometime this month.

Mr. Levine's reappointment to the Schlow Library Board was also announced at the meeting.

Mr. Williams spoke concerning the construction of the second segment of the State College By-Pass in College Township. A location had been decided upon more than a year ago but the State has changed plans since. Mr. Levine recommended that all Centre Region municipalities meet again with State officials and have an agreement made to construct the By-Pass where they wanted it.

A suggestion was made by Mr. Levine to apply for a listing with the National Flood Insurance Program, a federally subsidized plan which allows residents to purchase flood insurance at a discount. This program would be of no cost to the Township but would allow anyone in the municipality to purchase flood insurance at a rate of 40¢ per \$100. Mr. Williams made a motion to apply for the program and Mr. Weaver seconded.

A letter was read from the Clearfield office of the Department of Transportation to change the speed limit signs in Lemont from 25 - 35mph. Mr. Williams said that they would be busy with road work and that it would have to wait. The Supervisors are also hoping to receive public opinion from the questionnaires that were mailed to College Township residents.

Mrs. Smith made a suggestion to the Supervisors that the Township rent a Chipper to go around gathering branches and shrubs from residents. The machine would make chippings or mulch out of the trees and shrubs and then return it to them for their own use. Mr. Levine said the Supervisors would look into it.

Mr. Campbell, attorney representing Mary E. Whitman, and Ira Whitman were present at the meeting to ask approval of the Supervisors to replot two smaller pieces of land of their proposed subdivision and make it into one lot still to be less than the minimum requirement of one acre. It was understood that approval of the Planning Commission had to gotten first but the Whitmans could not wait another month for the next Supervisors meeting. The Supervisors decided to hold a special meeting proceeding the Planning Commission's meeting and if they approve the reploting the Supervisors will also approve.

The Supervisors confirmed that the traffic lights at the Houserville-Lemont intersection and the Y at the Mall were temporarily out of order and were repaired Monday October 4th.

Mr. Williams said something would be done concerning the removal of the large tree and shrubs that are obstructing the view at Gibbons St. and Houserville Road. The Zettles would be contacted regarding this matter.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:30.
