

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF  
THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
HELD DECEMBER 5, 1972  
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The College Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting on December 5, 1972 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Municipal Building. All members were present.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was read and approved as follows:

CORRESPONDENCE

A letter was read from Bruce Speegle, of the Department of Transportation, in reply to our request for a traffic signal survey at Puddintown Road and Benner Pike. He indicated that a survey would be made and the results would be sent to the Supervisors.

A letter from Norman Katz of Penn State Engineering regarding a Traffic Light request at Hills Plaza main entrance was read. It was indicated that the developer would pay the cost of having this light installed. The Supervisors sent a letter to the Department of Transportation requesting a traffic count be made for a light.

A copy of a letter from the Supervisors sent to Canadian Pacific Holding Corporation was read requesting that they put curbing along the Frontage Road parallel to Route 322 and Guard Rails along the Frontage Road parallel to Branch Road (14019). This was at the Hills Plaza Shopping Center.

Correspondence was read from J. R. Doughty, Department of Transportation, enclosing the permit #7058 for the traffic light at the Intersection in Lemont.

Correspondence was read from Jacob G. Kassab, Department of Transportation, formally announcing that the Fox Hollow Road Section was now turned over to the Township.

Further correspondence was read from Mr. Kassab, informing the Supervisors that the White Hall Road Section has now been taken over by the State. Mr. Williams mentioned that part of the White Hall Road was to be relocated.

A letter was read from Mr. Thomas E. Daubert of 378 Bradley Avenue expressing a complaint about the parking lot lighting at Hills Plaza. The Supervisors will look into this complaint.

A Memorandum from Mr. David Allison of the University Area Joint Authority was read in which they requested permission to erect a storage shed approximately 12' x 12' x 7' in size. Since this meets the required size set forth in the Ordinances, it was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Skinner that this request be granted. Motion was carried.

A copy of a letter sent to the Lemont Water Company was read. This was in reference to a petition presented by the Residents of Limerock Terrace for fire

hydrants. No reply had been received from the Water Company to date.

OLD BUSINESS

In regard to a request by Clair Brown to check on having the Yield Sign changed to a Stop Sign located at the Intersection of Route 322 and Branch Road, Mr. Williams reported that he received a call from the Clearfield office in response to a letter we had sent. They felt that to change the signs there would create a traffic hazard by cars backing-up on North Atherton Street. It was felt there should be more publicity on what the Yield Sign actually means. It does mean stop.

NEW BUSINESS

The Proposed Annual Budget for College Township was the next item on the Agenda to be discussed. The total estimated expenditures for the Year 1973 are as follows:

This proposed budget will be available for the public to look at within one week. Mr. Williams said this proposed budget represents a decrease of approximately \$20,000 over last year.

PLANS FOR APPROVAL

A Final Plan for the Culligan Subdivision, 400 Shiloh Road, was received. A discussion was held to verify if the conditions submitted by the Planning Commission were met. All conditions were met. It was moved by Mr. Skinner and seconded by Mr. Weaver that they approve the plans. Motion was carried.

A Final Plan for Richard N. Stover Subdivision of property located in Panorama Village was received. It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Skinner that these plans be approved. Motion was carried.

OPEN DISCUSSION

Mrs. Brown thanked the Supervisors for inquiring about the change of the Yield Sign to a Stop Sign at the Intersection of Route 322 and Branch Road.

It was asked by Mrs. Granlund if the Spring Creek Park Project will start this Spring? Mr. Williams said that it would. The Supervisors are hoping to be able to open bids in January, 1973.

It was suggested by Nuri Mohsenin that a letter be sent to the Planning Commission asking that a member of the Commission be present at the Supervisors Meeting to answer any questions that the Supervisors might have about plans to be approved.

Mr. Mohsenin inquired as to who the Dog Enforcement Officer was and his telephone number. Mr. Skinner informed him that it was Mr. Matthew Hennes. The telephone number was given to Mr. Mohsenin by the secretary after the meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 P.M.
