

COLLEGE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL
MINUTES OF ROAD INSPECTION
APRIL 25, 1983 1:00 P.M.

All streets in the Township were inspected and over-all they were found to be in good condition and relatively free of potholes.

The major storm water project and partial paving of Norle Street, Oakwood Drive and Rainlo Street will not be addressed since this project should start in June 1983 and the various road problems will be corrected at that time.

Other streets that should be considered for future projects are: Campbell Road, First Avenue (Eastern Part), Gibbons Street, Kennedy Street, Matilda Avenue, Spring Street, Struble Road, Warnock Lane.

Streets with potholes or depressions are: Big Hollow Road at curve, Grandview Road at College Avenue, Mobile Avenue & Squirrel Drive, Oak Lane at Houserville Road, Pennsylvania Avenue at curve, Wildot Drive at Campbell Road.

Streets which need berm work are: Bottorf Drive, Dale Street, Mary Street, Ronan Drive, Willow Avenue at Oak Lane.

Other deficiencies: Commercial Boulevard needs street sign replaced, Brush Valley Road needs "Welcome" sign, Henszey Street needs "No Outlet" sign, curbing has to be replaced on Penbrook Lane, Pikeview Road at Clover Road needs storm drainage and culvert replaced, Thompson Street and Watkins Lane need "No Outlet" signs, Grant and Liberty Streets which have now been accepted by the Township need street signs.

Other notes of interest: the propane gas cylinder tanks have to be chained when not in an enclosed area around the property of Jack Mitchell in the Trailer Park. Also, the area on Summit Road which is usually cluttered with automobiles looked quite good.

The Road Inspection was concluded at 4:45 p.m.
