OPEN DISCUSSION

No questions or comments made.

MINUTES

Council unanimously approved the minutes of June 10, 1982 (Regular Meeting) with the following correction on page 3 of 5 by Manager Lechner:

"CATA BUDGET APPROVAL: Dean moved that Council approve College Township's share of the CATA Budget for 1982-83. Seconded by Dargitz, and unanimously approved."

Council unanimously approved (with no corrections) the minutes of the June 17, 1982 (Public Hearing).

MANAGER'S UPDATE

1. Contacted Dave Schuckers, Government Liaison, and suggested that he personally contact Carroll Dean for discussions about the Park Road abandonment. Re: feasibility of abandoning the road to satisfy the University position with PennDOT with regard to Park Road Extension of the Bypass.

2. Letter sent 6/15/82 to PennDOT expressing Council's support for the Fox Hollow Road Bikeway/Highway Improvement Project.

3. Letter sent in Council's name to Elwood G. Williams Sr. on 6/25/82 requesting that he continue in the role of College Township Coordinator for the Emergency Management Agency.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR JUNE 1982

Council unanimously approves the June 1982 Treasurer's Report. (Dargitz moves; Bailey seconds).

Mr. Dargitz inquires whether the Township's accounts (as defined in the Treasurer's Mid Year Report) have sufficient funds and whether money in the accounts should be reshuffled (eg. for accounts that might be over spent). Dargitz asks: "Are there any accounts or separate funds that are showing much less revenue than expected or much more expenditures than expected?" Treasurer answers that all accounts are stable.

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CORRESPONDENCE

PLANS FOR APPROVAL

None are submitted

BUSINESS

1. Council unanimously agrees to send a letter to each member of the Post Office Construction Committee acknowledging their services. (Dean moves; Bailey seconds).

2. Council unanimously approves a Mileage Rate Increase from 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ to 20¢ (Internal Revenue Service permitted mileage) effective and retroactive as of July 1, 1982. (Dargitz moves; Dean seconds).

3. Manager Lechner reports that a consultant is studying Centre Region's (including College Township's) computer needs; Possible computer services for the Centre Region could include: establishment of a regional program which would utilize a common data base for the various communities and their public services, such as taxes, code enforcement, parks and recreation, records, etc. Consultant will conclude the study and submit recommendations in 2 months.

4. Council discussed the results of the Citizens' Survey.

5. Council informally requests Manager Lechner to pursue the best solution to the issue of signage at the intersection of University Drive and Curtin Road.

Background: Ron Turner (Clearfield Office) called Manager Lechner to request that College Township consider removing the "NO TURN ON RED" sign from this intersection for two reasons: 1) College Township is in the process of putting up a "WALK-DON'T WALK" light here, and 2) removing the "NO TURN ON RED" sign would ease traffic flow.

Manager Lechner suggested to Ron Turner that he put this request in writing so that Council can act upon it officially.

6. Chairman Taricani mentions potential problems for Landscape II (and by extension, College Township) if/when PennDOT reroutes a stream through buildings for the bypass. Chairman Taricani suggests that Manager Lechner investigate this.

7. Council unanimously approves PennDOT's awarding of a contract for the Struble Road and Benner Pike traffic light. This confirms earlier Council approval. (Bailey moves; Dargitz seconds).

8. Council discussed a request by Barbara Mills who seeks a variance for her recently purchased property part of which is zoned forest district, part of which is zoned residential. Chairman Taricani informed Mills (prior to this meeting) that Council has no jurisdiction to intervene in this case; Taricani requested the Zoning Hearing Board to hear this case as soon as possible.

9. Council discusses the Township Weed Ordinance as it is brought up by the case of Mrs. Hardy whose property is zoned forest district but still bound to rules governing mowing of weeds on land that borders the property of other home owners.

Council (at Chairman Taricani's suggestion) agrees to review the weed ordinance with the Township solicitor to investigate what corrective measures could/shoud be taken.

Council informed Mrs. Hardy during this meeting that it had no jurisdiction to take official action on this case, and that the most appropriate forum for this case will be at the July 16 Zoning Hearing Board's meeting.
