

MINUTES OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS MEETING HELD ON MAY 6, 1968

The Board of Supervisors of College Township met in the Municipal Building on May 6, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. All supervisors were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting of April 2, were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report -- The supervisors approved payment of bills in amount of \$8,569.48, leaving a balance of \$12,800.34.

Old Business - Traffic Light at Dale Summit - Traffic Count at Houserville Road Intersection. Mr. Williams reported that the Highway Department has been written for permission to install the traffic light at Dale Summit and for specifications for erection, and requested a traffic count at the intersection of Houserville Road and Banner Pike.

Spring Lea Drive intersection. The figure for land damages has been set and the solicitor is contacting the owner of the property to negotiate the sale of the land.

Boogersburg Road -- The Board approved a resolution to assume 1.25 miles of Boogersburg ^{Road} from the College-Patton Townships Line to Beaver Stadium at Curtin Road in exchange with the Highway Department for building the interchange and access on the State College By-Pass to the new hospital site. Notification to this effect will be sent to the Highway Department District Engineer.

The Board approved the request for funds in the amount of \$100.00 for the Council of Regional Governments for operating expenses.

The Board also went on record in favor of a re-assessment of property in Centre County and favored the re-assessment to be conducted by the County Commissioners.

Mr. Gordon D. Kissinger submitted final plan for the development of Section 1 of the Centre Hills Subdivision. After some discussion, involving principally, street names and grade problems at Haymaker Road, the Board approved the recommendation of the Planning Commission with respect to this plan, as follows: That the final plan for Section 1, Block No. 1 of the Centre Hills Subdivision, dated April 27, 1968, submitted by Gordon D. Kissinger be approved, with the provision that Haymaker Road at the intersection of Fairway Drive be brought up to grade requirements as

stated by the Zoning Ordinance. It was agreed that the changing of the name of Charles Street to Fairway Drive be concurred with at this time because of special situation existing, but that, in the future, a strenuous effort will be made to avoid any duplication with existing street names.

Mr. Kissinger also presented a plan for revision of plot plans for the Dalevue Development, which had been previously approved. This plan which was recommended for approval by the Planning Commission was specified as Revision No. 4, dated April 26, 1968, and was approved by the supervisors, with the decision that all of the street running out of Walnut Circle be called Walnut Circle.

Mr. Kissinger asked about the procedure for submitting a rezoning request for an area of his property and was advised to submit a formal request for zoning change to the Board.

New Business -- A petition from the Panorama Village Improvement Assn. requesting the Board to accept Villa Crest Drive as a township road and make improvements thereon was tabled to allow the Board time for consideration.

Bids for Township Grader -- One bid was received for the proposed purchase of a township grader, from the Stewart Equipment Company, Harrisburg in the amount of \$13,755, with an allowance of \$3,500 on the old equipment. It was moved by Williams and seconded by Weaver that the bid be accepted.

The Chairman announced that the hearing on the proposed Township Fee and License Ordinance scheduled for this evening would be postponed, so that the ordinance could be changed to conform to the fee schedule proposed in the regional ordinance on code enforcement.

Spring Clean-Up Days, which have been scheduled for May 6, 7 and 8 are proceeding according to schedule.

Dan Stearns and other residents attending the meeting voiced complaints about the sewer authority engineers, who have been making borings and surveys on people's property without the permission of the property owners. The supervisors stated:
