

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON NOVEMBER 10, 1970.

The regular meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held in the Municipal Building on November 10, 1970, at 7:30 P.M. All Supervisors were present.

The minutes of the October 13th, meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's Report - The Treasurer reported in detail the expenditures in the amount of \$10,356.37, leaving a balance of \$35,950.67.

Old Business: Mr. Williams reported on the Traffic Safety Problem on Route 322, in the area of Twigs Lane and Harris Acres. He said, the Supervisors would pursue the possibility of establishing a no-passing zone, and that he planned to meet with a Representative of PENDOT (Penna. Dept. of Transportation) within the next week.

New Business: Two requests for a Variance to the requirements for sewer connection were received. One request was from Harold White, Branch Rd., Lemont, and the other was from Stewart Bither, Grandview Rd. . Mr. White, does not want to connect to the sewer line, because he claims he will have to relocate all of his plumbing lines to do so. Also, his home is built on solid rock and is only partially excavated, hence, creating additional problems. In Mr. Bithers case, he does not wish to connect his basement. Mr. Levine, expressed concern about granting any Variances to the requirements of the College Harris Sewer Authority. He felt that by so doing you could establish precedents, which would make it very difficult in enforcing the requirements of the Authority. It was agreed to forward both requests to the Township Solicitor for further study and a recommendation on this particular problem.

A letter was read from the Penna. Dept. of Health, requesting a comprehensive plan from all municipalities by November 2, 1970. The Supervisors, agreed that the Centre County Sewer Study Plan would suffice for the Township's Plan for sewage facilities, with the addition of addendum #1 and #2.

Addendum 1 and 2 concern Harris Township and do not directly concern the township plan, but must be added if the overall plan is to be used. The supervisors voted unanimously to adopt the following resolution with the addition of addendum #1 and #2.

(RESOLUTION)

Indicating acceptance, submission and implementation of an Official Plan for sewage facilities in the (Township) of College, Pennsylvania.

Whereas, the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act., Act of January 24, 1966, P.L. 1535, Section 5, requires that each municipality shall submit for approval to the Pennsylvania Department of Health an officially adopted plan for sewage facilities serving areas within its jurisdiction, the (Township) of College, Pennsylvania, hereby resolves that the attached plan and addendum #1 and #2 submitted this 10th day of November 1970, is accepted as its Official Plan for orderly development of sewage facilities within its jurisdiction.

It is further resolved that this Official Plan will be implemented by the aforementioned (College) Township.

A question was raised about the parking on Grandview Rd.,-  
Mr. Williams reported, that he had received complaints about the residents of an apartment on the corner, parking in a manner, which made driving on the road very difficult. It was agreed that "no parking" signs should be erected, in the area in question.

Mr. Williams, said the Department of Highways had asked that the 25 mile speed limit on Branch Rd., be removed. The signs had been erected during the sewer construction, when the road was being repaired. Mr. Williams said, he would look into the matter.

Roger Grandlund reported that the school light by the Houserville School was not working properly. Evidently, the timer was off and the signal was flashing at 7:00 P.M. . Mr. Williams, said he would check and have the timer reset.

Mr. Grandlund also was concerned about the X-Rated Movies being shown at the Drive-In on Benner Pike. He felt that since the screen was visible from the highway and nearby homes some controls should be instituted. The Supervisors, said they willtake the matter under advisement.

It was reported that the Mitchell property on Old Mill Rd., has weeds growing in excess of the maximum height allowed in the Ordinance. Mr. Williams, said he would check on the notices, which had been sent out, and see if the owners of the properties had complied. Also, he said, he would send a notice to the Crown Construction Co., concerning the Nittany Mall Corner.

A resident, asked, if the proposed meeting with the Sewer Authority would be held. The meeting was to be of an informative nature. The Supervisors had written a letter to the Authority, but since over 125 people had come to the regular meeting, they were not certain that the Authority would still feel it was necessary to hold a special meeting.

Mr. Levine, reported that a survey of the local water companies was being conducted and that he would have a report on this matter at a later date. He explained that the purpose of this survey was to determine the feasibility of a community water system.

Finally a question was raised about a house which had been burned and turned over, the house is located between Houserville and Puddintown. Mr. Williams, said, he will look into the possibility of having the owner remove the house.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned, at 9:00 P.M.)
