

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF
THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
HELD JULY 11, 1972

The College Township Board of Supervisors held a regular meeting on July 11, 1972 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Municipal Building. All members of the Board were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with the following correction: Line 5 , page 3, to read Penna. Motor Truck Association instead of Penna. Mirror Truck Association.

The Treasurer's report was read and approved as follows:

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Williams said that the Supervisors would again request a traffic signal at the intersection of Elmwood St., Old Boalsburg Pike, and Branch Road. After a fatal automobile accident had occurred at the intersection, Mr. Williams contacted PENDOT concerning a traffic signal. He was advised that officials of PENDOT would give serious consideration to a request from the Supervisors. Mr. Williams said the Supervisors would also request no parking signs to be posted from the intersection of Branch Road, Elmwood Street, and Old Boalsburg Road to the intersection of Mary Street and Pike Street. Mr. Skinner made a motion that the

Supervisors adopt a resolution to request a traffic signal at the intersection of Branch Road, Elmwood Street, and Old Boalsburg Pike. The motion was seconded by Mr. Weaver and carried unanimously.

Mr. Williams reported on the traffic situation on Branch Road. He said that a No Passing double yellow line had been painted on the road. Also, PENDOT stated they had no schedule repairing the road at this time, nor could they estimate the cost of needed repairs. The Supervisors were advised that a schedule of repairs would be held up until claims with the College-Harris Sewer Authority had been settled. According to PENDOT, all bridges were reported to be in good repair and capable of bearing the legal load limit, and the department had no plan to widen the road now or later.

NEW BUSINESS

A report was read from the College Township Police Department for the six month period from January 1, 1972 to June 30, 1972. The report summarized the record of arrests and complaints.

The Supervisors approved two final plans for subdivision. The first plan was submitted by Corning Glass Co., Inc. for subdivision of their land located on Route 64. The portion of the tract which was subdivided will be occupied by the Centre Daily Times.

The second plan was submitted by the Centre Hills Country Club for subdivision of a 7.65 acre tract to be called Wasdale. It is located near Twiggs Lane off of Route 322 on Service Road A.

The Supervisors expressed concern about fill which had been placed in the Flood Plain on Upper Branch Road by the State College

Borough Water Authority. No application for a variance had been made by the Water Authority, and the fill is in violation of the Flood Plain Ordinance. Mr. Skinner said he had received a call from Mr. Everhart, who had owned the adjacent property for many years. Mr. Everhart stated that the natural drainage had been seriously affected by filling the flood plain. During the recent flood, it was evident that the water could not run off properly. Mr. Skinner made a motion that the State College Borough Water Authority be given notice and ordered to remove the culvert and widen it. Also, to bridge it if necessary in case of another flood. Mr. Weaver seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Larry Doerr presented a petition on behalf of the residents of Bottorf Drive and Houserville Road to request street lights. The Supervisors accepted the petition and said that they would be happy to comply with the residents wishes. Mr. Williams said he would submit a request to West Penn Power Company. Mr. Doerr asked if the residents could see the plan for lighting before it was installed, and he suggested that another light be placed on Houserville Road. The Supervisors agreed to keep the residents informed of their progress.

In another matter, Mr. Doerr asked if the Spring Creek Park could be closed at a certain time and patrolled by the Township Police. Mr. Williams said he would speak to the police, but the police could not be in the park at all times. The Supervisors agreed to suggest regular patrols, and advised the residents to call the Police if anything irregular occurs.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 P.M.
