

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF COLLEGE TOWNSHIP
HELD ON June 22, 1970

The special meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held in the Municipal Building at 8:30 p.m. on June 22, 1970.

The purpose of the meeting was to hold the final hearing on the amendment to Ordinance No. 35, which ordinance adopted the National Plumbing Code.

The section to be amended, Section 3, Article 2.20 l.b. now reads as follows: "Discharging to a public sewer system: Building sewers discharging to a public sanitary sewer system shall be 4" cast iron pipe or 5" extra strength vitreous clay minimum diameter, laid to a uniform slope."

The amendment is as follows: " Discharging to public sewer systems: Building sewers discharging to a public sanitary sewer system shall be constructed with approved materials having a minimum diameter of 4", laid to a minimum slope. Approved materials shall be designated as the following:

1. Service weight or heavier cast iron pipe, CS-188-1961
2. Asbestos cement pipe, A. S. T.M. C-428-59T
3. ABS Plastic Pipe, A.S.T.M. D-2282-64
4. Vitrified Clay Standard Strength Pipe USIA Spec. A 106.3 1967
5. Reinforced concrete pipe, A.S.T.M. C-361-59T
6. Any pipe with equivalent specifications to the above-listed materials."

A short discussion was held with two citizens concerning the amendment. Then Mr. Williams moved and Mr. Weaver seconded a motion adopting the above amending Ordinance No. 35, which ordinance adopted the plumbing code. The motion was passed.

Two citizens, Mr. Barry and Mr. Nelson, presented the supervisors with a petition signed by 309 residents of the township protesting the Highway Department's proposed interchange for the State College Bypass at Benner Pike near the Township Building.

The supervisors accepted the petition, but were unable to act on it since this was a special meeting called for the purpose of adopting the amendment to the plumbing ordinance.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
