

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
HELD ON AUGUST 4, 1970.

The regular meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was held in the Municipal Building on August 4, 1970, at 7:30 P.M. All supervisors were present. A group of about 60 residents of Arman Village were in attendance.

The minutes of the July 7th meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report - The Treasurer reported in detail the expenditures in the amount of \$10,981.61, leaving a balance of \$24,696.28.

Landfill - Peter's Property, Arman Village - Attorney Lilian Raycroft, substituted for J. L. Jubelirer, who represented the protestors. Letters from Attornies Jubelirer and Reed McCormick, for the township and a report of the Zoning Officer concerning the conditions were read. Numerous questions by the citizens were answered.

The Supervisors stated that they are considering the protests of dumping fill and may recommend a replot of the sub-division if this were legal.

There was considerable discussion about weed mowing.

Bypass Interchange at Benner Pike - Mr. E. Williams, Supervisor, discussed recent agreement with Penn DOT. in which Alternate 3 for the intersection at Benner Pike was agreed upon.

Mr. Williams also discussed Benner Pike accidents and it was decided to request the State for Lights at Elmwood St., and Puddingtown Road - and in addition to request a reduction in the Speed Limit from the State College Borough Line to the boundaries of College Township on Rt. 26. The aid of the Regional Groups would be enlisted to accomplish the desired results.

Letter from Tom Kerr - College Harris - Joint Authority re a variance to sewer connections from basements below sewer lines was referred to the solicitor.

Letter from Carl R. Kindred, re a proposal to prepare a design plan for the Park at Houserville for a fee of \$275.00 - was approved.

A Declaration and a Proclamation to support Police week - August 23 - 29 was read and approved.

Complaints of parking on the road right-of-way at Stewart Junk Yard were presented and will be acted upon.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:50 P.M. .
