

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF
THE COLLEGE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
HELD OCTOBER 3, 1972

The College Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting on October 3, 1972 at 7:30 P.M. in the Township Municipal Building. All members were present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

The Treasurer's Report was read and approved as follows:

CORRESPONDENCE

A letter was read from Mr. W. B. Shepperd of 3725 S. Atherton Street, State College, regarding the 45 Mile Speed Limit on Route 322 between Boalsburg and State College stating that he was against it. He expressed his opinion as to why he was against reducing the speed limit in that area.

A letter was read also from Mr. & Mrs. Frederick Ranck expressing their opposition to a zoning change proposed by Herbert Stewart for land located between Route 64 and Summit Road (the Dale Summit area).

BUSINESS

Bids were received and opened for Bulk Rock Salt from the following companies and their bid prices:

It was moved by Mr. Skinner and seconded by Mr. Weaver that they accept the bid received from Cargill, the lowest bidder, in the amount of \$14.91. Motion was carried unanimously.

Bids were received and opened for 1973 4-Wheel Drive Pick-Up from the following companies:

Stocker Chevrolet	@ \$2,871.56 which includes trade-in allowance of \$1700.00
Valley GMC Sales & Service	@ \$3,060.00 which includes trade-in allowance of \$2100.00

It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Skinner that they accept the lowest bid received from Stocker Chevrolet.

There was one bid received for a 1973 Police Car from Stocker Chevrolet in the amount of \$2,518.36 which included a \$950.00 trade-in for present cruiser. It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Skinner that they accept the bid received from Stocker Chevrolet.

BUSINESS (Cont.)

A Resolution was signed by the members of the Board designating Elwood Williams as the Applicant's Agent for the purpose of obtaining certain federal financial assistance under the Disaster Relief Act.

A petition was read from the residents along Limerock Terrace and vicinity to the Board of Supervisors asking them to request and implement placing of sufficient fire hydrants to reduce the present fire hazard due to the fact that there is absolutely no public source of water available for fire fighting. This petition was signed by 20 residents. Mr. Skinner moved that the Supervisors check with the Water Company to see what can be done about this situation before any further action be taken on this. It was felt that there might not be a large enough waterline in the area at the present time, to provide enough water for a fire hydrant. This motion was seconded by Mr. Weaver and carried unanimously

The Supervisors moved to accept the following roads as Township Roads:

Carolean Industrial Drive (998.60 ft.)

Addition to Struble Road (3408.33 ft.)

Mountain View Branch Hospital Access Road (3099.35 ft.)

Final Plans were presented to the Board Members for James Corl Subdivision of two lots into three 1 acre lots. This property is located at Carolean Industrial Drive and Struble Road. The conditions presented by the College Township Planning Commission were met; specifically, that the Owner of Lot #3 be identified, Ownership be Certified, and the Building Setback Lines be included on the Plans. Final Plans for the proposed Addition to Clarence Johnson Lot was presented. This property is located near the Boalsburg Pike and was previously included in the overall Nittany Orchards Subdivision Plans. The conditions set forth by the Planning Commission were that the Certificate of Ownership be completed and the Reference Datum be indicated on the Plans. These conditions were met. The Plan was approved by the Supervisors.

OPEN DISCUSSION

Mrs. Claire Brown expressed her appreciation for having the speed limit reduced to 45 miles per hour on Route 322 from the Branch Road to Boalsburg.

Mrs. Sue Smith inquired about the signal light to be put in at the intersection in Lemont. Mr. Williams informed her that nothing further has been received from the Highway Department as yet. The papers have been sent to Harrisburg.

Mr. Skinner mentioned that he had quite a few calls regarding the rejection of the bus subsidy by College Township. He also indicated that in reference to the size of apartment houses, State College has set a Minimum of 750 sq. ft. for apartment houses.

ANNOUNCEMENT

Mr. Williams announced that October 30 and 31 would be set for TRICK-OR-TREAT nights.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:10 P.M.
