

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING
COLLEGE TOWNSHIP -- December 5, 1967

The meeting of the College Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Levine at 7:30 p.m., December 5, 1967 in the Municipal Building. All supervisors were present.

The minutes of the meeting of November 14, 1967 were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report Mr. Weaver reported that expenses during the month *totalled* \$7,223.17. The Board approved payment of current bills.

Old Business Mr. Williams stated that the best way to solve the problems at the intersection of Spring Lea Drive and Houserville Road would be to remove about two feet of topsoil from an adjacent lot, going out about 25 feet on Houserville Road and 50 feet on Spring Lea Drive, and then replace it. The cost would be around \$4,000. Mr. Williams was asked to secure engineering drawings for the project and to contact the Township Solicitor to make an offer to the owner of the land affected.

With respect to the drainage problem on Spring Lea Drive, Mr. Williams suggested that the drive be widened, blacktopped and curbing installed, so that the water would be carried off on the blacktop. Mr. Williams was asked to secure an estimate for this work so that it could be included in the 1968 budget.

Nittany Mall Landscaping -- Dan Stearns, Zoning Officer contacted Crown Construction Company with respect to the landscaping around the light standards, but as yet, has had no reply to his letter.

New Business -- Sign, Weed, Peddler's Ordinances -- Proposed copies of three ordinances concerning signs, weed control and peddlers were recommended for adoption by the Planning Commission. The Chairman announced that ^apublic hearing will be held after the first of the year on the three ordinances. Questions from the audience were answered by the supervisors.

The Chairman announced that he had had the Township Solicitor draw up

a proposed ordinance requiring utility companies to make all installations of meters either inside houses or in certain specified places near the houses. This proposed ordinance is now being reviewed and discussed by the Regional Council on Government and the Regional Planning Commission, as well as by the borough and the townships for possible regional adoption.

Institute of Public Administration Study -- The supervisors expressed their willingness to cooperate with this study to be conducted by the Institute at Pennsylvania State University on the functions, activities of regional government in the area, provided all other townships and the borough agree to cooperate. Any action on the study was tabled until such time as other local governments have indicated support.

Schlow Library Budget Request -- The Budget request from Schlow Library this year has increased about one thousand dollars to \$5,561, out of a total of \$55,612. No action was taken on this request at this time, as the Chairman stated that the Council on Regional Governments is attempting to work out some coordination between Schlow Library and the County Library as a possible solution to the problem that arises each year from two separate requests for funds.

A letter from Mr. Alvi Voigt making suggestions concerning a connecting road from University Drive to Branch Road in the vicinity of the Centre Hills Country Club and street maintenance problems in the Dalevue area was referred to Mr. Williams for investigation and to Mr. Power of the Regional Planning Commission for his comments on the proposed connecting road.

The Board approved the suggestion of the Borough of State College that the transfer of the Liquid Fuels Tax involved in the recent annexation of township island be postponed until after the new census.

Another request from State College Borough regarding a change in the speed limit on University Drive will be investigated by the Board, and if the change seems reasonable, the Board will agree.

A letter from Mr. Lowder requesting a change in zoning from R-1 to R-2 on land which he owns and on which he is proposing a subdivision was referred to the Planning Commission for action.

Special Reports-- Swimming Pool Authority. Mrs. White, township representative on the Parks and Recreation Commission, presented some facts on the proposed swimming pool authority and introduced Dr. Fred Coombs from the State College Swimming Association and Dr. Rupert Kountz of the Suburban Swimming Pool Committee and Robert Ayer of the Parks and Recreation Commission who discussed further present swimming facilities, the need for additional facilities in the Park Forest Village area and the possibilities of developing additional pools under an authority-type operation. During the course of the discussion, it was suggested that a meeting of persons involved in the State College Swimming Association, the Swimming Pool Committee and the Parks and Recreation Commission be held in the near future with representatives from townships and the borough to further clarify the scope and possible functioning of the proposed authority. Action by the Board was tabled until after a report can be obtained from the suggested meeting.

By-pass Progress Report Mr. Williams stated that he had contacted both the Highway Department at Clearfield and Gwin Engineers and found out that final work on the by-pass will start soon on Benner Pike and move eastward. He said he was assured that the present line was north of the township building, the new church, and the township park. Weather has delayed the taking of aerial photographs, but Gwin Engineers anticipated that this work would be completed by December 10th.

Announcements -- The police report scheduled for this meeting will be postponed until January meeting since Mr. Lightner is ill.

A representative of Nelson Motors in the audience asked a question concerning the Zoning Officer and enforcement of regulations concerning lighting. Mr. Grandlund of the Planning Commission stated that present lighting regulations require that the source of lights ~~not be visible from the highway~~. Reflectors ~~must be used to cover the source of the light~~ so it cannot be seen directly from the highway and ~~cause~~ ^{constitute} a safety hazard. The Chairman explained that Mr. Stearns, as Zoning Officer, is empowered to enforce the lighting regulations of the township. If Nelson Motors is dissatisfied with the regulations, they can go to the Board of Adjustment for an exception or variance.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
